

# DyFRA and Golden Triangle Community Projects

## 1988 - 2022

- 1988 The Daffodil Way national trail completed by the Windcross Paths Group.
- 1992 The Poets' Paths 1 & 2 completed and maps published.
- 2004 12thC St Mary's Church, Kempley - an ancient monument managed on behalf of English Heritage.
- 2005 Daffodil seed guardians (75 in many parishes) verge renovation, across the Golden triangle 'traditional daffodil weekend social events and walks.
- 2006 150 years Bethel Chapel exhibition and social history research.
- 2007 The Big Draw, a primary school Arts event held in C12th *St Mary's*, Kempley, with an exhibition in the village hall for parents.
- 2008 Heritage Open Days St Mary's and St Edward's churches with architectural guided tour with historian interpreting the 'most complete wall paintings in Britain'.  
Restoration Yew walk and gapping up of perimeter yew hedge in St Mary's Kempley, with English Heritage's grounds contractors.
- 2009 90 years social history exhibition Kempley - centred on the 1911 census.
- 2010 *KempleyTardis.org.uk*, HLF project, 4 years community engagement.
- 2014 – 2019 HLF chronicle project focus on centenary of WW1.
- 2014 *The Centenary Memorial* Aug 4th 2014. Nine Men of Kempley WW1 app, and remembrance project - through to 1919 (2019).
- 2017 Partnership formed with Forestry England, under a Memorandum of Understanding.
- The Garland Hut war poets and bothy exhibition renovated and Landscape 'Cultural Continuum' exhibition. Dymock Poets and Windcross Paths.

# DyFRA and Golden Triangle Community Projects

## 1988 - 2022

- 2019 The Centenary Glade planting of 600 trees, conifer clearance and restoration work by volunteers. Grass seeding, daffodil meadow and mowing regime instituted with community volunteers. Liaison with Forestry Commission.
- 2019 *Centenary Walks in Dymock Woods* publication, The centenary of Forestry Commission, the auction sale of Beauchamp Estate (many of the Golden Triangle farms and estate houses) July 4<sup>th</sup>.
- 1919 Statement of Climate Change and biodiversity emergencies.
- 2020 Mar 1<sup>st</sup> St David's Day Symposium – Managing Public lands – 50 people and four speakers from statutory Countryside Agencies.
- 2020 – 2021 Covid shutdown – no volunteer work permitted.
- 2021 Second year moth and botany surveys for County records.
- 2015 – 2021 Habitat renovation work by volunteers at *The Centenary Glade*, Queen's Wood, GL18/HR9, with phase 2 project - landscape recovery extension to create wildlife corridors for a contiguous ancient woodland nature network.
